Professor Peter Openshaw is the Director of the Centre for Respiratory Infection (CRI) at the National Heart and Lung Institute, Imperial College London. He is also Professor of Experimental Medicine and an Honorary Physician in the Department of Respiratory Medicine at the St Mary's Campus of the Imperial College NHS Trust. His research is on the immunology of the lung, viral lung disease, vaccination and immunopathogenesis of viral disease.

Dr Stefania Vergnano, Division of Child Health, St George's, University of London is a prominent researcher on antibiotic treatment in children who participated in the establishment of the Neonatal infections surveillance network (NeoIN).

Dr Vanda Friman is a well-known specialist of infectious diseases in Sweden and associate professor at the Department of Infectious Diseases at Sahlgrenska University Hospital, Göteborg. Her main interest is infections in patients with primary and secondary immunodeficiency, both children and adults.
